

Tesla Model 3

Before driving

Unlock the vehicle

To enter the vehicle simply touch the key card on the black window pillar next to the driver's side door. The door will unlock and both driver and passengers can enter.

Start the vehicle

Once inside, place the key card on the middle console next to the cup holders and press the brake pedal to start the vehicle's engine.

Driving modes

To choose your driving mode (Drive or Reverse) use the main stalk on the steering column. You can switch between modes by moving the stalk up and down.

The Park option is a button on the end of the stalk. Press this and leave the vehicle for it to stop operating.

Vehicle infotainment and navigation

Vehicle infotainment and navigation can be controlled via the main screen in the middle of the dashboard. This operates like a smartphone where you'll also find other personalisation options, including climate control, Bluetooth and more.

Window and door controls can be found next to the vehicle's door handle.

While driving

Important driving information can be found on your vehicle's centre screen. This includes your speed and charge level.

Drivers will notice the centre screen changes when in park mode to allow opening of the front boot or charge cap.

A Tesla may take a few kilometres to get used to, as the braking is different from a normal car. Regenerative braking means the vehicle loses speed quite quickly when the driver removes their foot from the accelerator. Excessive manual braking is not needed, and the vehicle uses this ability to capture energy and return it to the battery, while making it easier to drive.

There is also no obvious parking brake. After coming to a complete stop, press the 'P' button on the end of the stalk and the vehicle will safely hold and not roll.

Charging

Your Tesla is simple to charge. Follow the below steps:

1

Open the charge port by your centre screen or tapping on the charge port cover.

A white light inside the charge port will show that you're ready to charge.

2

Firmly plug the charge connector into the charge port and the light will rapidly flash and change to blue.

The light will then change to green, but continue to flash as it charges.

3

Charging is complete when the green light stops flashing.

An amber light means the charger isn't plugged in properly, so you'll need to try again more firmly.

A red light means the charger isn't operating.

To unplug the charger:

1

Press the charger's clearly visible connector button.

2

The green light will change back to blue and then white.

3

When the light is white you can take out the charger and return it to its holder.

(4

Make sure the vehicle's charge port cover is closed before resuming driving.



Free charging with Chargefox

All SIXT Australia customers get free electric vehicle charging with Chargefox. Your vehicle will come with a Chargefox card or fob, which can only be used at Chargefox locations.

The card or fob is already linked to a SIXT Chargefox account, so all you need to do is follow the instructions on the charger, and tap/swipe at the location and plug in the charger. A full list of charge locations can be found on the Chargefox app which is free to download from the App Store or Google Play.
